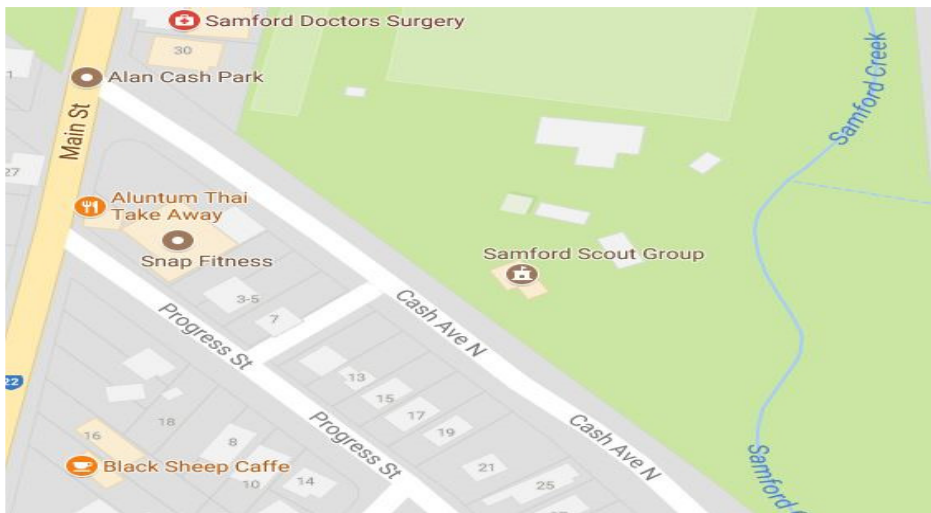
If you are reading this information then you or a family member have, or are thinking of, becoming a member of the largest youth organisation in the world.

## Tryout Sessions

If we have availability in the relevant Scout section which suits your child's age, we will ask that they attend for 2 nights so the child, parents and leaders can ensure that Scouting is right for your child. We will ask you to print, complete and bring an F6 Authority form with you to the first night.

## Waiting Lists

If the youth member limit has reached maximum capacity for the sections of Joeys, Cubs or Scouts, the child will be placed on a Waiting List for membership when it becomes available.

Preference for youth places to join will be offered on the following basis:

- 1st : Children of adults who are prepared to undertake Assistant Leadership roles in that Section
- 2nd : Children of adults who are prepared to undertake Adult Helper roles in that Section
- 3rd : Children of adults who commit to a two year term of office on the Group Committee (if vacancies)
- 4th : Siblings of existing members of the Samford Scout Group.
- 5th : The oldest of the members on the waiting list from the start, then those listed for the longest.

Please note that participation as an Assistant Leader or Adult Helper at Samford Scout Group will not only ensure your child a place in our Group, but will also allow it to remain operational – leadership roles are extremely rewarding and fun.

### Fees – Membership for Joeys/Cubs/Scouts/Venturers/Rovers

### **Fees - Section Term Subscription Fees (Subs)**

All youth members are required to pay a Term Subscription Fee (often also called Subs) payable for each term (4 per year) for equipment and incidentals used in Section programs during that term. Subs are due at the start of each school term, and are to be paid preferably by bank transfer, or quarterly direct debit, to the bank account below.

### **Fees - External Activities and Camps**

Notification of camps or special activities will be advised to you on a form called a C4, which will need to be completed, signed and returned to the Section Leader prior to enable youth member participation. We may also send consent forms to you via the Operoo App, which require you to supply consent by response. If monies are required for the any activity advised, we will provide instructions or payment via online banking, credit card payment, or cash.

## **Always Sign Your Youth Member/s IN and OUT**

When dropping your youth member/s off and picking them up, whether it is for a den meeting night, or camp, or special activity, it is important that you sign them in and out. Your leader will show you where the **Signing Book** is - usually on the table located on the right hand side inside the front door at the den building entry.

## **Your Child's Medication**

If your child is required to have medication or has a medical condition please consult with your leader regarding the treatment.

Medication is to be provided in its original package with clear instruction. If medication is required for attending school then it will be required for scouting activities especially for behavioural issues.

Leaders are not allowed to offer panadol/asprin to youth. If a youth member requests it, then it can be provided.

Scouts Australia has an organisation-wide set of acceptable behaviours which is known as The Australian Scout Promise & Law. When each youth member is invested, they pledge to uphold this Promise & Law. We discuss the Promise & Law within our group, but it is also helpful if these are discussed at home as they are great guidelines for life. If a youth member does not believe they can uphold the Scout Promise & Law, then this probably isn't the activity for them.

At Samford Scout Group, we aim to create positive relationships with the youth, making them feel safe and supported within the Group. We ensure youth are treated with respect, consistency, fairly and equitably and support them in achieving their full physical, intellectual, emotional, social and spiritual potentials as individuals, as responsible citizens and as members of their local, national and international communities.

## The Australian Scout Law

As they continue through Scouting the youth become increasingly responsible for the delivery of the programme "*Youth Leading, Adults Supporting*". This is why it is so important to embed these ideas early in the Scouting journey. How the Law plays out at Samford Scout Group is described below.

Our Mission as Samford Scout Group is to:

- Provide youth members with challenging and adventurous opportunities to grow and develop.
- Support adult members in providing those opportunities.

### Examples of behaviours that **DO** support our mission

- Treating others with respect (both youths and adults)
- Listening and staying quiet when required
- Being friendly to everyone
- Participating in the program

### Examples of behaviours that **DO NOT** support our mission

- Swearing
- Bullying
- Disrupting Parade or other activities
- Refusing to follow a request
- Stealing or damaging equipment
- Physical or sexual abuse

## Immediate Consequences for behaviour that does not support our Mission

1. A Warning is issued
2. Time out within sight of a leader
3. Parents are contacted
4. Exclusion from the next week's meeting

Note: In the case of extreme behaviour a parent will be contacted without the child having received a warning or time out.

## Long-term Consequences for behaviour that does not support our Mission

If a parent is called 3 times in a term the parent will be required to attend all subsequent events to assist their child to behave appropriately, for a period of up to 6 weeks.

- In some cases, this may happen after a single call, if the behaviour is extreme.
  - In exceptional cases the child will be excluded from Scouting activities and meetings for up to a month. After which time the parental supervision as above will commence.
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- If a parent does not attend during this 6-week period, then the child will be asked to stay home.
  - If the behaviour continues with improvement during this period then the child may stay with Samford Scout Group, with a behaviour plan created by Leaders and the parent.
  - If the behaviour continues without improvement during this period then the child will be asked to leave Samford Scout Group.
  - If the behaviour restarts after this period then the child will be asked to leave Samford Scout Group.

If your child has a medical reason which makes appropriate behaviour difficult, we are happy to work with you on a basic behaviour management plan to help them succeed in Scouting. However, we ask you to please be mindful that our leaders:

- are volunteers and not specifically trained in education or behaviour management
- are responsible for the safety and program delivery for the whole section and these whole-section needs must come first
- have family and work commitments outside of Scouting and so may not have time available to discuss individual behaviour management at length.
- may ask for mandatory attendance also by the parent or suitable representative, as a supportive requirement for youth involvement

## Transporting Youth Members to Scouting Activities

To transport youth to scouting activities the following conditions must be met for the safety of youth.

- All vehicles must be in road worthy condition and have current third party insurance.
- All drivers shall be licensed.
- Local traffic regulations relating to seating, seat belts, loading, speed and the consumption of alcohol and drugs shall be observed.
- The carrying of youth members as pillion passengers on motor cycles is prohibited.

## Uniforms

When you receive your Scout membership letter you will receive a Scout membership number and this will give you access to all the member information on the Scout web site. Plus, you can then log in with your member number to the online Scout Shop.

All youth and adult scout uniform needs are to be purchased online from the Scout Shop at <https://scoutshop.com.au> You will need to sign in to be able to view and purchase all items.

## Parent Patrol – Den Cleaning

At Samford Scout Group we are fortunate enough where we should have enough parents to be part of our Parent Patrol for Den Cleaning - to clean the den each school week and only once per year per parent. As being a part of this Parent Patrol, each parent is expected to clean the den when it is their turn. A copy of the roster is displayed on the pin board kitchen side of the front door. An email or text may be sent as a reminder.

To access the den a key is kept in a lock box and the location and combination of the lockbox will be provided to you before your rostered duty.

The tasks to be under taken are

- Sweeping of the den floor
- Wiping of the kitchen bench tops down
- Mop of the kitchen floor
- Empty the bin if needed
- Clean the toilet floors down (use shower to hose)
- Scrub the toilet with the brush
- Empty the bin
- Restock toilet paper if needed 3 rolls are preferred (spare rolls kept under the kitchen sink)

The usual time taken to do the above for most people will take approx 1-2hrs max and some people find it convenient to do this when their youth member/s are attending a den night. By doing this it makes the den a better place for all youth and adults members to enjoy the facilities.

All outside grounds maintenance including lawns and trees is handled by a gardening contractor.

If you need to report any issues or suggestions regarding den or grounds facilities, including workplace health and safety issues, please do contact the Group Leader.

## **We need Leaders, Adult Helpers & Youth Program Supporters**

Parent helpers are always welcome and are encouraged. It can be a wonderful opportunity to be a part of young lives developing. There may be times when parent helpers are called upon for activities or if a section is short of a leader. A parent helper or two is a great help to the leaders as it helps to better run an activity together..

No experience is required just a will to help and follow instruction if required. Regular parent helpers (more than 4 times per term) will need to be signed up as Adult Helpers and blue carded and Samford Scouts are happy to oversee all sign up and blue card applications for this role.

Please see your sectional leader and they will organise the Group Leaders to explain further about how you can help.

Parent helpers are covered by Scouts Qld insurance.

## **Blue card Requirements**

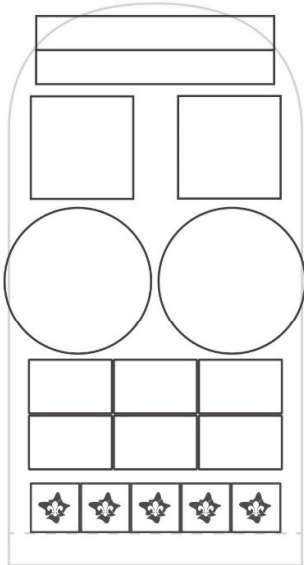
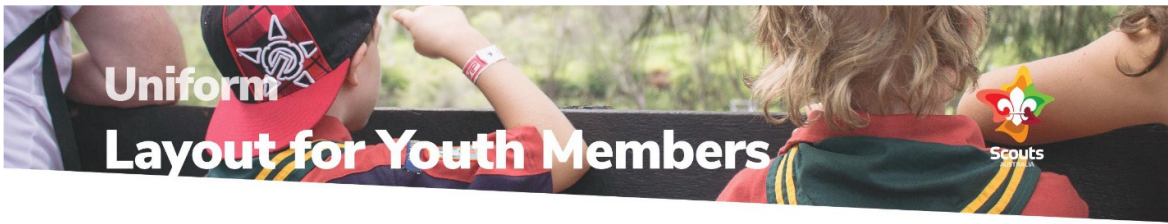
